ASSOS – AYVALIK TRIP

After breakfast at the hotel drive to legendary Mount Ida (Kazdagları), 1774m high and above the Gulf of Edremit. Once known as the home of the ancient Greek gods and goddesses, Homer referred to it as “The house of the Gods” from where they charmed, seduced, tricked, married and betrayed one another. This area is important for its natural environment its history and culture. Kaz Mountains has one of the highest oxygen ratios in the world with the Swiss Alps having the highest and which is generated by the wind blowing from its northern edges, blending with the oxygen from the dense flora and then iodine coming from the sea on its south-side. Upon arrival to mount IDA we will visit Tahtakuslar Museum, Zeus altar in Adatepe village and Olive oil museum in Kucukkuyu, then continue to drive back to Istanbul.
