 - 500 word personal essay (details included in application form);
 - Copy of the front page of your passport and any U.S. visas you already have;
 - Bank statement indicating that you have sufficient funds to cover expenses for the duration of your study in the USA;

APPLICATION PROCESS cont'd:

- o Certificate of Finances for International Students (CFIS) requesting a <u>DS 2019</u>;
- o Résumé/CV
- Immunization form if you will be under age 26 when you begin your study at AU;
- Official English language exam results either requested to be sent directly to SIS
 (TOEFL: code 5007, IELTS: select School of International Service) or verified as official
 with a signature from your institution's international office; and
- Verified official transcript signed by your institution's international office.
