^{*}Philosophy, Politics and Economics is a course that explores great works of economic, social, political and philosophical thought and it does so with the conviction that these fields are not just extensively interconnected but also fruitfully and perhaps more fully understood through shifting and interlocking these fields and the various vantage points they bring against one another. The University of Oxford was the first institution to offer courses and degrees in PPE in the 1920s, but it is now offered at several other leading colleges and universities around the world. The course here in Stockholm University takes us from the ascent of money which at the 6th century BCE coincides with; the emergence of philosophy in ancient Greece, the Indus valley and what is later to be our present-day China, each development not just significantly influencing the specific politics of that time but even more profoundly defining the very essence of the political and how best to organize it. From then on we embark on a journey through the shifting landscapes of Philosophy, Politics and Economics and their fascinating interplay throughout time in order to see what our past can teach us about our present and future.
