Admission Process:

- Home university needs to make online nomination of students at: https://prd28pi01.itesm.mx/Recepcion/StudyInMexico/Socios/Login
- 2) After nomination students will receive an application form to their email (this application is unique for each student since it is linked to their nomination).
 - a. Within the application students will need to upload a scanned copy of their valid passport.
 - b. When finishing application and uploading passport students will need to click "send" in order to finish with this process.

After completing these steps students will be receiving admission by email approximately in two weeks. Email of admission will have acceptance letter attached to it. One week after students will be receiving an additional email from the international programs office with the international student handbook with information regarding housing options and registration, medical insurance and immigration requirements, academic policies and procedures (course selection).





HOUSING:

Housing will be assigned on a first come basis upon receiving applications. Information regarding registration and details will be send by email after admission. Housing in residence halls or host family cannot be guaranteed. If any of these options are not available a large amount of independent rent options are available in the university area.

<u>Live off campus</u>. The majority of our international students rent an apartment upon arrival to Monterrey. Plenty of options are available in the university surroundings. We recommend to make contracts and reservation until arriving to Monterrey. More information about rental companies can be found in international student handbook.

<u>Live with a host family</u>. Affectionate and friendly families that participate in the Host Family Program welcome students with open arms and additional benefits:

- Discover the warmth and charm of a Mexican family
- Experience Mexican customs and authentic cuisine
- Practice your language skills on a daily basis

<u>Live in a residence hall</u>. Enjoy a global experience interacting with and living among students from Mexico and many other different nationalities. There are 16 residence halls open to men and women. However, none of them are co-ed. seven residence halls are oncampus and nine are off-campus, only a few blocks away. The buildings vary in their accommodations.

Immigration Requirements

If you are going to stay in Mexico **less than 180 days** you do not need to process a visa prior to your arrival, unless your nationality requires it. In order to learn more if you require a visa please visit: https://www.inm.gob.mx/gobmx/word/index.php/paises-requieren-visa-para-mexico/

Students staying in Mexico more than 180 days, must have a **Temporary Resident Student Visa**, previously obtained in your home country.





Medical Insurance

All international students require to have a medical insurance during their studies at Tecnologico de Monterrey. If you are an exchange student and you already have an insurance you may keep it, only if it fulfills the following requirements:

Academic Information

- 1. Academic load: The maximum allowed academic load for both undergraduate and graduate students is 48 units (18 credits) for the January May and August December semester terms. Notwithstanding, we recommend you not to exceed 32-40 units (13-15 credits), whereas foreign students need time for other activities that will enrich their international experience.
- 2. Evaluation System: The Academic Administration Department provides that there will be at least three partial and one final student progress evaluation. Each teacher will determine which other evaluations are required in his/her course and the dates when they will take place. Progress evaluations are done in different fashions:
 - a. Written tests in the classroom (multiple choice, true or false, essay, etc.).
 - b. Individual or group classroom presentations
 - c. Virtual tests (www or Blackboard).
 - d. Individual or group research.

In each case, the teacher will state the scoring criteria (content, size, format, type of presentation, etc.) in advance.

The grading scale is 1 -100, and the minimum grade to earn credits is an average of 70 at the end of the term. For the purpose of allowing foreign students to convert these grades to the scale used at home, two months after the course is completed a full transcript will be mailed by Tecnologico de Monterrey to their school detailing the names of the assignments and grades earned, with a letter describing the grading system used at Tecnológico de Monterrey.

Academic Programs:

The language of instruction can be English, Spanish or both.

Tecnologico de Monterrey at Monterrey offers 6 different academic options to suit your needs.

1. Spanish as a Second Language, Business in Latin America and Mexican Culture

To be internationally competitive, you need to develop certain skills and behaviors, but also gain knowledge about specific cultures. With these culturally oriented courses you will not only learn to speak Spanish-the third most spoken language in the world- but also obtain an invaluable knowledge about Mexico's way of thinking and conducting business in Latin America that will give you an edge in your career. Courses are offered in both Spanish and English. Take these courses as part of your academic load while studying in Monterrey. Mix them with other courses from your specialty and get the most out of your experience in Mexico.

2. Certificate Programs

Tecnologico de Monterrey, Monterrey Campus offers undergraduate certificates in a variety of fields. A certificate is an academic specialization in a certain area of study. Currently, there are 5 certificates available to international students. The courses offered under the certificate programs are classes that Mexican students also take as part of their specializations, so as an international student you will be interacting with these and other international students in the classroom.

3. Internship Program (Companies, Research and Consulting)

Participate in any of the three internship modalities that we have available for you.

Consulting: Participate in an entrepreneurial internship by collaborating with our Business Incubator Network where you will be able to give support to the creation and development of start-ups as well as providing the tools and support required by the entrepreneurs in order to have more and better opportunities to start and create their own business.

Regular University Courses Taught in English and/or Spanish

At Tecnologico de Monterrey you can attend any of our regular courses taught in English or Spanish in any of the academic fields available at Monterrey Campus and have the credits applied to your college degree back home. Take advantage of more than 150 courses offered in English from different academic areas such as: Business, Engineering, Social Sciences and Humanities.

Special Requirements

For courses taught in English:

If you are a non-native English speaker, you will need to meet one of the following requirements:

- -TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language): At least 550 points on the Paper-Based Test (PBT) or 313 points on the Computer-Based Test (CBT)
- IELTS (International English Language Testing System): At least 6.5 points
- A letter from a certified source (English teacher or language instructor) that states that you have sufficient knowledge of the language to take courses in English.

For courses taught in Spanish:

If you are a non-native Spanish speaker, you will need to take Tec de Monterrey's on-line Spanish Placement Test to assess your level of Spanish. You will be required to score an advanced level to be able to take classes in Spanish.

All foreign students are allowed to attend our courses, according to their Spanish language skills. If they show evidence of having skills in the location test, they may enroll in any regular course taught in Spanish. In case Spanish skills are low you have the option of taking regular courses taught in English and Spanish Language courses.

Some courses are taught both in Spanish and English, but they are offered according to the demand. Therefore, foreign students interested in taking any of these should check before enrolling whether they are available or not. Available regular and special courses are listed in the Academic Brochure issued by the International Programs Department.





In the case of the United States, our 8-unit semester courses are equivalent to 3 credits in the U.S
